Perhaps we'll come to a more balanced perspective.

We have some exciting things happening just now in St Andrews. We are running our first ALPAH Marriage Course. It does appear to be going very well. We have just appointed Rose Sharp to the Young Families Worker position. Her main task will be to set up and lead a Sunday morning Intermediate-Aged Youth Group, and through that, to establish connections with the families of the children. The position is for 10 hours/week.

Our Sunday preaching theme for September will continue with the Book of Acts. These are awesome chapters. I do pray you find it inspiring stuff.



July's offerings were \$11,331 which is \$3,125 down (22%) on July 2024. There has been a noticeable 'drop off' in giving since March. Before March, weekly giving was averaging approximately \$3,370. The weekly average giving has not exceeded \$2,750 per week since February.

Fortunately expenses this July were 9% lower than July last year, but still resulting in a \$250 deficit for the month. Needless to say, I'm on an economy drive as much as possible.

The annual financial accounts have been audited and finalised for the AGM on 5th October. Until All Have Heard

Matt Perry, executive director of Far East Broadcasting Company (FEBC) NZ, proved an informative and compelling speaker at the August St Andrew's Fireside meeting.

The meeting drew a number of ladies from other Matamata churches in what has become a popular quarterly Christian fellowship gathering. Matt, raised Anglican and now Baptist, commended the various denominations in meeting together, noting that there is only one Church. He noted that, when Jesus talked to crowds, his technique was to put himself in a place – eg in a boat out in the shallows or on an incline – where His voice would be amplified.

And, so it is with FEBC which – using the catchphrase Until All Have Heard – spreads the Gospel in 152 languages to 50 countries around the world via short-wave radio.

"We do this because all peoples must have the opportunity to know that there is a good and beautiful life for them in God," Matt said. FEBC is committed to one thing and that is sharing Christ with a world where one in three people have little or no access to Jesus Christ. Matt said that FEBC knows listeners are tuning in because of the many text messages, emails, phone calls, letters and visits.

The meeting heard that around half of China's Christian Churches have their roots in FEBC and how, in countries where Bibles are forbidden, people memorise the Gospel.

After Matt's address – which drew a number of questions – the gathering enjoyed afternoon tea and more browsing/shopping at the sales table, proceeds from which, as well as the koha, will be donated to FEBC.
