

attending will experience real spiritual growth through it. We have leaders, but could do with more helpers for backup.



We can argue until we're blue in the face about whether there is or whether isn't – climate change.

Whatever side of the fence you claim, or whether you're simply sitting on it, the tragic devastation caused by Cyclone Gabrielle gives pause for thought.

I don't need to list Gabrielle's tally – we know what they are; we've viewed them on-screen daily from the safety and comfort of our home.

I believe that, as Christians, we need to take better care of our God-given world – we are its trustees, its stewards.

When we view the world as God's gift to us, we will do our best to take care of it and use it wisely, instead of poisoning or destroying it. We are accountable to Him as to how we use it.

Billy Graham reminded us almost 20 years ago that, after creating Adam: *The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it.* (Genesis 2:15).

"God didn't tell him to exploit the world or treat it recklessly, but to watch over it and use it wisely.

Like a good ruler, we should seek the welfare of everything God entrusts to us—including the creation, "Graham said.

Yes, our Lord commissions us to rule over His creation in a way that sustains, protects, and enhances his works so that all creation may fulfil the purposes God intended for it. We must manage the environment not simply for our own benefit but for God's glory.


HOME COMMUNION



In a nutshell our income for the 10 months to 31 Jan 2023 is greater than we had budgeted and our expenses are less than we budgeted for. Of the \$41,206 increase in income \$5,300 is from pledges over and above the \$9,000 we budgeted. We also received a \$20,000 donation to be used for a specific purpose. It's good to see that our expenses are running behind budget as well and this is attributed to small savings over a number of areas. We give all thanks to our faithful God for His provision!


